He was the initial Endoscopy Lead at Cancer Care Ontario (CCO) from 2011- 2014 where he helped design the Endoscopy QBP. Dr. Gould has been a member of numerous Colon Screening Guidelines and Quality committees at both the provincial and national levels.

He is currently the President and Medical Director of the Vaughan Endoscopy Clinic. He is also a partner and the current President of Toronto Digestive Disease Associates (TDDA), a specialty research company, that participates in many GI clinical research trials and is a principal investigator on many trials. Dr. Gould is currently the Endoscopy Director at William Osler Health System.

Dr. Gould is actively engaged in all aspects of gastroenterology and is always a resource to our profession and specialty. He is the proud father of Ashley and Jonah and has been married to Dianne for 33 great years. Dianne has supported Michael through all the activities and has helped the OAG in many capacities through the years. Dr. Gould is an avid golfer, skier, and a cycling enthusiast.
